A Fast and Simple Process:

Step # 1 – Locate your Original photo

Step # 2 – Discuss and Learn the Regulations and Options then Complete the Order Form

Step # 3 – Bring the Form, Cemetery Certificate, Photo, and Payment to the Cemetery Office.

Step # 4 – In approximately, 6 to 8 weeks the cemetery will install your stainless steel image.

Step # 5 – Receive your original photo returned to you in the mail

How the Stainless Steel Portrait is to be installed at the cemetery's mausoleum space?

All portraits are to be oval, vertical, made of stainless steel, frameless with no boarder, and consist of a bust only of a deceased person entombed or inurned in the burial space.

For some Abbey Crypts (5 or more names), and most cremation niches, or in cases where approved special use crypt privilege containing cremated remains the **M2 or 1.18" x 1.57"** portrait size is required. No more than one portrait per person is permitted. No person can appear in more than one portrait. The person in the portrait must be deceased and buried within this burial space*. (Choosing not to provide a portrait for a person does not grant permission to provide an additional portrait for another person).

For a True Companion Crypt, a Single crypt, a Couch Crypt or a Side by Side Companion Crypt the **P 3 or 3 1/4" x 4 1/4"** portrait size is required. No more than one portrait per person is permitted. No person can appear in more than one portrait. The person in the portrait must be deceased and buried within this burial space*. (Choosing not to provide a portrait for a person does not grant permission to provide an additional portrait for another person).

For a Abbey Crypt, a crypt with 3 or 4 names on it, the **P 9 or 2 3/4" x 3 1/2"** portrait size is required. No more than one portrait per person is permitted. No person can appear in more than one portrait. The person in the portrait must be deceased and buried within this burial space*. (Choosing not to provide a portrait for a person does not grant permission to provide an additional portrait for another person).

For Glass Front Cremation Niches only the **P 5 or 2 3/8" x 3 1/8"** portrait size is required. No more than one portrait per person is permitted. No person can appear in more than one portrait. The person in the portrait must be deceased and buried within this burial space*. (Choosing not to provide a portrait for a person does not grant permission to provide an additional portrait for another person).

* Pre-need portrait placement will require prior completion of an owner/survivor designation form and pre-need inscription.

Where is the Portrait placed?
Vertical Placement (Column)

For an Abbey Crypt, and most cremation niches, or in cases where approved special use crypt privilege containing cremated remains the proper placement will be to the left – at the beginning of the deceased's Year of birth.

Horizontal Placement (Row)

For a Couch Crypt or Side-by-Side Companion Crypt the portrait is installed as **the left of the year of birth for the person buried on the left and to the right of the year of death for the person buried on the right**

For a glass front niche the portrait will be installed on a bronze easel inside the niche the HORIZONTAL placement stated above with the easel placed between the sidewall and the urn. This will provide full view of the urn.

BETWEEN the names placement is **reserved for a double image portrait only**. (No additional placement is permitted). This placement **where inspected and determined** on crypts and niches will require inspection and may prohibit future placement of emblem, feature, or term of endearment governed by various cemetery programs. A special affidavit may be required in the event the portrait placement encroaches on future inscription space or future emblem reserved space. The cemetery will not remove a previously placed emblem or feature to accommodate a portrait.

Notice:

Improper adhesion, Improper placement, Improper fabricated materials, Improper size, Improper attire, improper affixing or attaching items to a stainless steel portrait will warrant the immediate removal of the portrait.

Some additional concerns?

All portraits must be made of stainless steel, oval, without frame, no border, vertical image placement, and must be installed flush to the crypt or niche cover as prescribed by this program.

Additional Documentation may be required?
A pre-need portrait placement will require designation and pre-need inscription work completed prior to filing this order.

The original Certificate must be presented when placing the order.
